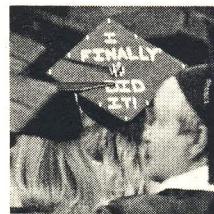
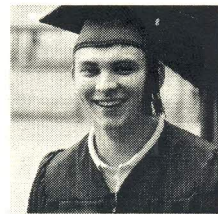

PROFILE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR

The Office of the Registrar reports the following demographic information regarding the Class of 2005. It is included to provide a useful background for other data contained in this report.

- Between December 2004 and August 2005, 1,569 degrees and certificates were awarded to 1,541 individuals.
- Baccalaureate degrees were awarded to 1,165 graduates: 919 Bachelor of Science; 147 Bachelor of Arts; 31 Bachelor of Social Work; 62 Bachelor of Science in Nursing; eight Bachelor of General Studies; and six Bachelor of Science in Engineering.
- Among the graduates, 96.2 percent identified themselves as of white, non-Hispanic ethnic origin; three percent of the graduates classified themselves as minorities; and .8 percent as non-resident aliens.
- Among the graduates, 64.7 percent were female, up slightly from 64.1 percent in 2004.
- 49.8 percent of the graduates were from Gibson, Posey, Vanderburgh, or Warrick counties, while 14 percent of degree recipients were from other area counties. Graduates from all other counties in Indiana represented 19.9 percent of the graduating class; 15.8 percent of the degree recipients were from other states; .5 percent were from other countries.
- Baccalaureate degrees were awarded by, the College of Liberal Arts (34.7 percent); College of Business (24.4 percent), College of Education and Human Services (19 percent), College of Nursing and Health Professions (14.9 percent), Pott College of Science and Engineering (6.3 percent), and Extended Services (.7 percent).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY / FOLLOW-UP SURVEY

This report is a six-month follow-up of the 2004-2005 graduating class; responses were received from 52.1 percent of the graduates.

EMPLOYMENT RATES

- 93.8 percent of the respondents are employed or actively seeking employment. The remaining 6.2 percent are either enrolled in additional academic coursework or have chosen not to seek employment at this time.
- 16 percent of the bachelor's degree recipients are enrolled in graduate or professional school. This number plus the number employed or actively seeking employment will exceed 100 percent because many new graduates are employed while also pursuing graduate school coursework.

- Of the graduates who are employed, 70.9 percent have secured new positions and 29.1 percent are employed in the same position that they held prior to graduation.
- Among bachelor degree recipients who are employed, 88.3 percent are working "in their field or in a field in which they expressed satisfaction", a slight increase from 88 percent in 2004. (Education majors employed as substitute teachers are coded as working "in their field".) Among ALL graduates employed, 91 percent are working in their field of study (2004 figure = 89.7 percent). Overall, these numbers have not changed significantly in the past two years.
- Among all bachelor degree recipients, the number of underemployed (i.e. working in a field unrelated to their career goals) is 10.6 percent. Among bachelor degree recipients who are employed, the total number of underemployed bachelor graduates decreased slightly to 11.7 percent (2004 figure = 12 percent).
- There were 20 (4.5 percent of the total respondents, 4.8 percent of the total seeking employment) bachelor graduates unemployed (not working and not enrolled in additional coursework or attending graduate school but seeking employment).

CONTINUED EDUCATION

- Among bachelor degree recipients who completed the questionnaire, 16 percent were attending graduate school within a year of graduation, up .2 percent from 2004 (15.8 percent).
- Among associate degree recipients, 36.1 percent are currently completing requirements for a baccalaureate degree, down 13.9 percent from 2004 (50 percent).
- Among bachelor degree recipients, four percent are enrolled in additional undergraduate coursework, an increase of .9 percent from 2004 (3.1 percent).

GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION

- Among all employed graduates, 76.6 percent accepted employment within the tri-state (a 60-mile radius of the University), a significant increase of 4.1 percent from 2004 (72.5 percent). Fifty-one of these individuals reside in Kentucky or Illinois.
 - 24.2 percent of the employed bachelor degree recipients left the tri-state area in 2005, a 5.1 percent decrease from 2004 (29.3 percent).
 - 24.4 percent of the employed master degree recipients left the tri-state area in 2005, a 1.9 percent decrease from 2004 (26.3 percent).
 - 10.8 percent of the employed associate degree recipients left the tri-state in 2005, a 7.5 percent decrease from 2004 (18.3 percent).
- Among all the 2005 graduates, 12.6 percent left the tri-state to accept employment

elsewhere in Indiana (14.3 percent in 2004), bringing the total number of 2005 graduates who work and utilize services in Indiana to 88.8 percent. Even if the 51 Illinois and Kentucky residents are subtracted from the tri-state figure, the state retention rate for 2005-employed USI graduates was up four percent to 81.8 percent, compared to 77.8 percent in 2004.

SALARY STATISTICS

- The average starting salary for baccalaureate degree graduates securing NEW, FULL-TIME POSITIONS was \$30,882*, a 2.5 percent increase over the average starting salary of \$30,120 in 2004.
- The average starting salary for associate degree graduates securing NEW, FULL-TIME POSITIONS was \$33,922*, a decrease of 3.2 percent over the average starting salary of \$35,030 in 2004.

*Because most associate degree recipients graduate from the College of Nursing and Health Professions (fields in high demand) it is not surprising that, on average, associate degree salaries are higher than those for recipients of four-year, non-technical degrees.
