To start researching for your Classical Argument, you will create an Annotated Bibliography of no less than **8 sources** by citing your sources using MLA Documentation style. At least 80-90% (6-7) of your sources will come from the internet. I will never criticize you from citing a book or periodical, however, this should be an exercise in learning proper citation of various internet sources...they're not all the same. Finally, you are only allowed to research using the following phrases after the key words of your Google search "site:.edu" or "site:.gov." This will result in retrieving .edu or .gov sources.

For example, "Write a concise annotation that summarizes the central theme and scope of the book or article. Include one or more sentences that (a) evaluate the authority or background of the author, (b) comment on the intended audience, (c) compare or contrast this work with another you have cited, or (d) explain how this work illuminates your bibliography topic" (Engle, Blumenthal, and Cosgrave).

To start researching for your Rogerian Argument, you will again need to create an Annotated Bibliography. You will need to provide no less than **10 sources** using MLA Documentation style. This time, however, you will be citing **periodicals only**. **You are not allowed to use web pages.**

For Example, “Never before have we had so many tools to learn and to communicate. Yet the art of talking, listening and ascertaining the truth seems more elusive than ever in this Internet and cable age, lost in a bitter stream of blather and misinformation” (Dowd, A25).
