His latest book, co-written by Ann V. Milliard, is Apple Pie and Enchiladas: Latino Newcomers in the Rural Midwest. It was nominated for the Senior Book Award of the American Ethnological Society. The text examines the historical and contemporary aspects of lives and experiences of Latinos in the Mid-West region. Modern-day concerns like ethic differences, prejudice, poverty, the social impact of a low-wage workforce, and public policy related to taxation and the welfare system are covered in the book.

The Big Read offered a series of events related to short stories in the anthology Sun, Stones, and Shadows. The

program, made possible by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts, was sponsored by the University of Southern Indiana in collaboration with the Evansville Literacy Coalition, Evansville Public Library, YMCA, Ivy Tech Community College, HOLA, WNIN, and the USI Foundation.
