


Study Abroad Participation

USI has experienced significant growth in the number of students participating in study abroad opportunities over the past five years.

- 2007-08 112 students, 20 countries
- 2011-12 223 students, 20 countries

Study abroad opportunities are not limited to students. Since 2007, 22 USI faculty members have led 41 study abroad trips/programs for USI students.

Global Engagement Initiative

In summer 2012, USI launched the Global Engagement Initiative to provide opportunities for four students to have research, study, and intern abroad experiences focused on global issues such as public health, education, environmental issues and human rights. The program has been expanded to provide eight students such opportunities in summer 2013 in Ghana, India, Scotland and Costa Rica.

Study abroad opportunities significantly impact students' self-perspectives regarding diversity and inclusion.
