USI Class of 2012

Board of Trustees Meeting May 3, 2013

In 2012, USI awarded bachelor's degrees to 1,443 students, 10% (129) more than in 2011.

- 945 entered as new freshmen (65%)
- 439 transferred from other institutions (30%)
- 34 started as non-degree seeking students (2%)
- 9 enrolled at USI prior to 1985 (entering status unknown)
- 16 returned to USI and completed a 2nd Bachelor degree

CLASS OF 2012: NEW FRESHMEN

Students who began their academic careers at USI as new freshmen represented 65% of the class of 2012, the same percent as the 2011 class.

SAT / ACT Test Scores and High School GPA

Class of 2012 members who started as new freshmen and graduated from USI in four years or less were typically better prepared academically, with higher SAT or ACT test scores and high school GPA, than those who took longer to complete their degrees.

Entering with High School or Other Credit


Credit earned in high school, such as AP credit or by testing out of certain subjects through departmental exams, can decrease the time to degree. Among new freshmen of the 2012 graduating class, 59% who had such credits graduated within four years, a 6 percent increase from the class of 2011.

Gender Differences in Time to Degree Completion

Females in the 2012 graduating class who began their careers at USI as new freshmen continue to be significantly more likely to graduate on time compared to males.




Time to Degree and Number of Credit Hours Earned

Among 2012 graduates who entered as new freshmen:

- 37% graduated within 4 years
- 47% graduated within 5 to 6 years
- 16% took 7 or more years to complete a degree.

Of students in the class of 2012 who graduated in four years, 77% completed more than the 124 credit hour minimum required for graduation.



CLASS OF 2012: TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer students comprised 30% of the 2012 graduating class. The majority of these students transferred from Vincennes University or Ivy Tech-Southwest.

Time to Degree Completion for Transfer Students

Among transfer student graduates, 49% (214) entered USI with 63 or more transfer credit hours (the minimum requirement for junior status at USI) compared to 50% in 2011. Of those, 30% graduated within two years, up three percentage points compared to class of 2011, but 38% took four or more years to graduate, a two percentage point decrease compared to the class of 2011.
