

Incoming Student Enrollment


USI has experienced a significant increase in graduate student enrollment over the past 10 years. The number of incoming graduate students in 2013 (306) is almost 40% higher than the incoming class of 2004 (219).

Compared to 10 years ago, the number of incoming freshmen has dipped, from 2,104 in 2004 to 1,709 in fall 2013. The number of new transfer students has also declined, with only 569 in 2013 compared to 651 in 2004.



Freshman Retention

Increased efforts to improve freshmen retention through a variety of academic and non-academic programming has increased the 1-year retention rate by 10 percentage points from 59% in fall 2004 to 69% in fall 2012.



Undergraduate Student Enrollment


Total undergraduate enrollment declined 3%, from 9,217 in fall 2004 to 8,913 in fall 2013, a difference of 304 students.


Graduation Rates

Graduation rates continue to improve. Compared with the fall 2000 entering cohort, the fall 2008 entering cohort 4-year graduation rate has risen by nearly 3 percentage points. The cumulative 6-year graduation rate improved, up from 32.9% for the fall 2000 cohort to 35.5% for the fall 2006 cohort.

<u>Degrees Awarded – Academic Year 2003-04 to 2012-13</u>
Along with improved graduation rates, the number of USI degrees awarded annually has also increased significantly. Up from 1,479 in 2003-04 to 2,018 in 2012-13, this represents a 36.4% change over 10 years.
