





TUITION AND FEES AT USI

- 2014-2015 fees for USI are:
 - \$2,082 or 24 percent less per student than the average of the other four-year public institutions in Indiana
 - \$2,854 or 30 percent less per student than the average of the other four-year residential public institutions in Indiana



2014-2015 TUITION AND FEES






STATE APPROPRIATION

- State of Indiana provides funding on a formula basis
- 2014-2015 appropriation per-FTE-Hoosier student at USI is:
 - \$2,113 or 28 percent less than the average of the other four-year public residential campuses




2014-2015 APPROPRIATION PER-FTE-HOOSIER STUDENT
