## Brian L. McGuire will bring Commencement Address



Dr. Brian L. McGuire

Dr. Brian L. McGuire, professor of accounting, associate dean of the College of Business, and director of the Master of Business Administration program, will deliver today's Commencement address. He is the current Integra Bank Distinguished Professor, an award presented to him during the spring USI Commencement recognizing his significant contributions to the University, its students, and the larger community.

Dr. McGuire has 15 years of professional experience in the College of Business. His teaching and research interests include cost accounting, healthcare administration, and accounting information systems.

He is a strong proponent of providing students challenges and

experiences beyond the classroom. His work with students in state and national competitions has resulted in multiple awards for the Accounting Department. In June 2010, a USI student team won the National Institute of Management Accountants Student Case Competition, the third straight year a USI team captured the National Championship.

This summer and fall Dr. McGuire spoke at regional and national conferences for the Institute of Management Accountants. His work has earned numerous Best Paper Awards at national and international academic conferences. Recent journal articles have been published in Management Accounting Quarterly, Review of Business Information Systems, and the Journal of Business and Economics Research.

Dr. McGuire has professional experience in public and corporate accounting and is certified as a public accountant, a management accountant, a business manager, and an information technology professional. He has served as an administrator of a medical center, director of Corporate Operations of a hospital holding company, and as a consultant in the healthcare field.

He holds an exemplary record of service to the University. He is the co-chair of USI's Business and Engineering Combined Programming Task Force. He has chaired the Council of Department Chairs/Program Directors, the Student Affairs Committee, and the Honor Student Symposium Committee during his career at USI. He also has served on the University Core Curriculum Council and the Service Learning Committee among others. In the College of Business, he has served on or chaired the strategic planning committee, the faculty affairs committee, faculty research seminars, and numerous other college committees.

He holds leadership roles in a professional organization and in local community groups. He is the chair-elect of the Institute of Management Accountants and a trustee with the IMA Foundation for Applied Research, Inc., the IMA Memorial Education Fund, Inc., and the Institute of Certified Management Accountants. In Evansville he has served the Boy Scouts of Buffalo Trace Council, Downtown Evansville, Inc., Girl Scouts of Raintree Council, Inc., and the Southwest Indiana Workforce Development steering committee. He is the immediate past president of the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra.

He earned the Doctor of Philosophy degree in business administration from the University of Central Florida and undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of South Alabama. He is married, and he and his wife Jean have two children. They have lived in Indiana for the past 15 years.

## **Commencement Traditions**

#### Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds; in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. Donated by the late Melvin Denner, professor emeritus of biology, and Anne Denner, former instructor in nutrition and biology, and their family, this medallion was fabricated by Honorcraft for the 1995 inauguration of H. Ray Hoops. Dr. Denner served as grand marshal at the University's first inauguration.

The University of Southern Indiana Presidential medallion signifies the authority invested in the president. The medallion's obverse carries, at its center, a three-inch reproduction of the University seal and, surrounding the seal, a half-inch rim. On the reverse appear the names and dates of appointment for the University's presidents. The president wears this medallion for all formal academic ceremonies.

#### Gonfalons

Ceremonial flags called gonfalons originated in the Middle Ages for civil and military processions, often appearing beneath the steel head of a knight's lance. In Italy, gonfalons designated individual Italian republics; the chief magistrate or other high official served as gonfalonier carrying the banner.

At the University of Southern Indiana, gonfalons represent each major academic unit; typically deans or department heads act as gonfaloniers. Here gonfalon colors derive from traditional hues associated with each college's academic disciplines. Our commencement gonfalons come as a gift from the USI Bookstore.

#### University Seal

The University seal, designed by Nussmeier Engraving, bears the University's colors—red, white, and blue—with gold. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance. Between the two banners displaying the University's name appear a band and an open book bound together by the torch of knowledge. In the band, rays of light emanate simultaneously from a rising sun, symbolizing the young University, and from the torch, symbolizing the light of knowledge and the passion for scholarship. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral southern Indiana setting but also life, growth, and continuity.

Beneath this band, an open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; academia populi and academia populo indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by the people, for the people. Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

### University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces. Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry. At the University of Southern Indiana, the grand marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of Richard Owen's walking cane serves as the staff for the University mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen was the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen, the Welsh industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32-inchtall wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874; and through the generosity of his descendant, the late Kenneth D. Owen, that cane, lent to USI, served as the grand marshal's staff in all commencement exercises from 1985 to 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the gold-plated mace bears at the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb with a replica of the University seal. The orb's free-flowing design symbolizes interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Immediately below the cane's orb, three two-inch, golden rings bear the names and appointment dates of the University presidents. The names of Kenneth Dale Owen, Jane Blaffer Owen, and James A. Sanders, donors of the mace, appear on a finial near the bottom of the cane replica.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and its base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

#### Academic Regalia

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design the wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet.

Retired members of the University faculty and administrative staff can be recognized in today's ceremony by the red, white, and blue cords worn with their regalia.

#### **Hooding Ceremony**

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. Hooding signifies the induction of the graduate into the fellowship of the academy, a welcoming gesture by those who represent the high standards of scholarship and creative achievement. During today's ceremony, master's degree candidates will receive hoods distinctive to their degrees.

# Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with the highest scholarship index is graduated summa cum laude. Baccalaureate students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher are graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 are graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement Exercises by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.

Because students enrolled in master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade-point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

#### University Honors Scholars

The designation of University

students who successfully complete
the Honors Program. They can be
recognized in today's ceremony by
the white honor cords worn with
their regalia.

#### Alumni Association Pins

Graduates in today's ceremony are receiving lapel pins with the University logo as a gift from the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association.

# Photography During Ceremony

A commercial photographer is taking photographs of each graduate as he/ she shakes hands on stage. Each graduate will receive a proof from which duplicates can be ordered. Family members who wish to take still or video photographs during the ceremony are asked to use the restricted area on the floor. Your cooperation ensures the dignity of the Commencement ceremony.
