

<u>Energize Evansville Volunteers</u>: The major portion of the Energize Evansville initiative allows the public to get active in the city's parks and other locations. Its' purpose is to bring people together and raise awareness about fitness and the city at the same time. Fitness in the Park is being coordinated by the Mayor's office and will include a new location every month.
