Richard Thompson was recently awarded Sigma Tau Delta's Eleanor P. North Poetry Award. His poetry has appeared in *Skive Journal*, *Empirical Journal*, and *The Avenue*, among others. Thompson grew up in rural Canada, and now lives with his wife, Sherise, and son, Jacob, in Houston, Texas, where he is a clinical psychologist and studies creative writing at the University of Houston.



Bradford Kammin's fiction has appeared in *The Gettysburg Review*, Arts & Letters, the Cimarron Review, and elsewhere, and has been recognized in *The Best American Short Stories* anthology's list of distinguished stories. He is a graduate of the University of Michigan's MFA program in creative writing, where he was awarded six Hopwood Awards for his short stories, novel, and nonfiction. Kammin is currently pursuing a PhD in English and creative writing at Western Michigan University, where he teaches creative writing and serves as fiction editor of *Third Coast*.
