



What Is It?

CAP is a dual credit opportunity; your high school teacher meets adjunct faculty requirements and teaches the required USI content.





Why Do It?

CAP allows students to earn college credit before setting foot on a campus. This can save families money and accelerate college progress.





Why Shouldn't I Do It?

- •Do you know you are strong in the subject and won't get a poor letter grade?
- •Too many dual credits that don't apply to your college coursework could use up federal financial aid hours you'll need in college. Do you know if the courses will count as required courses or electives? Be selective.

What Is The Process to Enroll?

- 1. Sign and submit <u>Student Permission Form (SPF)</u> with your requested courses (every time!)
- 2. Complete the <u>online CAP application</u> (<u>first time CAP students only!</u>)
- 3. <u>Investigate course usefulness</u> before 100% refund window ends (every time!)
- 4. Pay your bill once (mailed home) by <u>payment deadline</u> (fall late September, spring early February (*every time!*)
