Prior to enrollment, students considering World

Languages CAP credit should be aware of the following:



Students initially enroll in 203 and must earn an A or B to continue to 204; completion of 203 is <u>required</u> for registration in 204. Students who earn a C in 203 may only continue on to 204 with instructor approval. Per state law, students with a final grade of D or lower in 203 may not enroll for credit in 204. 203 is often aligned with the fall semester of the 4th year, while 204 is offered in the spring semester of the 4th year. If your school has a different alignment, your instructor will share those details.

Students who earn an A or B in 203 will earn 6 hours of departmental credit for use at USI only. Departmental credit is awarded based on the assumption that success in 203 indicates mastery of the content in 101 and 102. Students with departmental credit will not have to take a World Languages placement test at USI.

USI departmental credit for 101 and 102 can be used *only* at USI and will not transfer to other colleges or universities. The credit for 203 and 204 <u>is</u> transferable.

<u>Future USI Students:</u> For students who plan to attend USI, completion of 203 and 204, as well as departmental credit for 101 and 102, may fulfill the Bachelor of Arts World Languages requirements. Speak to an advisor for details.
