    - Recruitment and retention (Dr. Doss's perspective)
      - Student advisory board is important to her in the retention aspect to be able to work through problems that come to light through these meetings
      - USI experience starts with 'US'
      - Students may not be able to pay to continue college
        - Looking for more monetary resources to provide scholarships for these students
      - Supporting ways in navigating grit and resilience to combat homesickness
        - o Individualized education and connection to the university
      - Number of high school graduates are decreasing significantly contributing to lower recruitment
    - Repurpose academic programs
      - Nursing students
        - Those who don't get into the program aren't going into another health profession, looking for ways to address this
      - Core 39 and liberal arts classes
        - Important for students to display range of knowledge and diversity/inclusion
      - All academic programs can take some more love
    - Things she's passionate about
      - Reducing wait time in counseling center
        - Success: 2 months --> 2.5 weeks
          - New part time counselor helping this issue
        - Counseling service is not for primary psychological care
          - Limit patients to 12 sessions per semester
    - Housing

- Is there a goal for retaining on-campus residents? Numbers have been down
  - Have met occupancy of 80-85%
  - Numbers being down is due to enrollment being down
- Kitchen in residence halls
  - Not a fan of kitchen in residence halls
    - Huge liability
    - Too many incidents in kitchens
    - Giving somebody a place to properly cook may prevent hazards that arise when rules aren't followed
  - Write a proposal and push it through if we feel very strongly
  - about Amy Price may have different opinions
- General resources
  - Unified master list of social media accounts
    - For instance: knowing to follow Student Health Center for info on hours and events
    - FAQ to know what resources are available
- Student Health Center (Brandy Sitzman, MHA—practice manager)
- o Be Well to Do Well Program
  - Rec, Housing, and Counseling Center
- RA's: if you have any programs that you want, if you need condoms to give to residents, or literally ANY thing you need, contact Brandy!
  - USI students most common birth control is the withdrawal method –NOT GOOD
- Clarify who pays the fee and how the payment works
  - On tuition bill as fee, every semester; currently \$70
    - Housing residents are REQUIRED to have the Office Visit Plan
    - Off campus students can opt out, must complete paperwork
    - Can only see USI students, faculty, and staff
    - Office Visit Plan includes:
      - o Unlimited office visits
        - o No copays
      - o Annual physical
      - Several tests including strep, mono, flu test, pregnancy, and urinalysis
      - Annual flu shot
- Hours—potential emergency hours?
  - Evenings or weekends have tried in the past, nobody showed up, could not justify keeping these hours
- Location, very difficult to find—insufficient signage
  - They hope to move closer to the center of campus, but can't confirm anything
  - Signage is strict, they will see what they can do
- Advertising for locations and events that they may hold (pop up flu shot clinic)
  - She will send to Bower and will distribute to our social media pages
- Medical supplies—instances where crutches have been needed and not supplied, no flu tests available
  - She would like to know when this happens!
