Emergency Housing Assistance

YWCA (812) 422-1191 Our Emergency Housing Program offers many of the services available to our domestic violence clients to women and their children who are homeless.

Aurora (812) 428-3246 ***Call this number to set up an appointment for a student seeking emergency housing in a homeless shelter. They will meet with the student for an assessment, then place them in a shelter with available space in the area.* Aurora staff provides phone-based information and referral options to numerous individuals daily. We also compile listings on various topics such as rental units, employment, medical care, financial assistance, shelters, hot meals and other resources. Our office is also able to make food referrals through the Food Pantry Consortium and to other independent pantries as needed. Local phone access and resource lists are available to anyone.

Albion Fellows Bacon Center (812) 422-9372 For over 35 years, Albion Fellows Bacon Center has been strategically working toward preventing domestic and sexual violence in our community and offering services to empower victims. Our services assess barriers to safety and self-sufficiency as well as the emotional and psychological needs of victims. Our programs use the Trauma Informed Care framework, focusing on the overall well-being of each individual. Includes emergency housing assistance for women and children.

Ozanam Family Shelter (812) 422-2214 A 501(c)3 non-for-profit organization providing families and single women with emergency temporary shelter. Residents are provided with three meals and two snacks daily. Our programs are designed to provide residents with the necessary tools to aid in their struggle to identify and overcome the barriers that attribute to homelessness. We also strive to assist residents in building and maintaining stronger support systems for themselves and their families as they regain their independence.

Clothing

Guests check in and are given a generous list of pieces that they are allowed to choose from, and they can come back every 2 months.

Evansville Christian Life Center (509 South Kentucky Avenue, Evansville, IN 47714) (812) 423-9222 Our Clothing Department provides affordable clothing in our third-floor store. Are you looking for appropriate clothing for job interviews or work? Our Career Clothing provides a variety of professional clothing to meet your needs. Open Tuesday – Friday, 9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. To shop in Career Clothing, you must either have a scheduled job interview or be currently employed (The first Career Clothing outfit is available at no cost).

Other Various Needs

Ark Crisis Children's Center (415 Lincoln Avenue Evansville, IN 47713) 812-423-9425

Provides emergency childcare assistance, Monday – Friday 7:30AM – 5:00PM year-round. Their center is remaining open during COVID-19 precautions. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided for all children in their care. They also provide formula, baby food, and diapers for babies while in their care. Through Ark's Car Seats for Kids, families can receive free car seats. Families do not have to be low-income, and they do not have to reside in Vanderburgh county to access this resource.

Other supplies/financial assistance (Mission of Grace 418 East Gum Street Evansville, Indiana 47713) (812) 464-2919 The Mission of Grace provides emergency financial assistance for rent, utilities, prescription medication and food. We also offer information and referrals to other appropriate resources in the community. We try to keep our Giving Room stocked with cleaning supplies, personal hygiene items, and baby

supplies for those who have no financial means to obtain them. Open Wednesday and Saturday from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm.
