The University of Southern Indiana (USI) was awarded a four-year \$1.7 million-dollar federal HRSA grant: "Advanced Nursing Education Nurse Practitioner Residency Program (ANE-NPR)." The grant will provide nurse practitioner (NP) graduates in the specialty areas of family nurse practitioner (FNP) and psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner (PMHNP) with a 12-month residency program working with rural and underserved populations. The program will support a total of 12 graduate NPs over a 3-year period of time.

USI is collaborating with community-based health clinics to provide these unique experiences.

The resident's focus will be both clinical and academic enhancements that will prepare them as primary care providers in these complex areas. The residency program includes precepted clinical practice, specialty rotations, mentoring sessions and enhanced didactic education.

Qualify for enhanced reimbursement from Medicare and Medicaid*, as well as other benefits. Serve an underserved area or population. Offer a sliding fee scale. Provide comprehensive services (either on-site or by arrangement with another provider), including: Preventive health services, dental services, mental health and substance abuse services, transportation services necessary for adequate patient care, hospital and specialty care. Have an ongoing quality assurance program. Have a governing board of directors.

NPR + GWEP

NURSE PRACTITIONER RESIDENCY + GERIATRICS WORKFORCE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

The USI Geriatrics Workforce Enhancement Program (GWEP), a five-year grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), is focused on bridging the medical and social care provided to older adults and to train current and future healthcare professionals.

The USI GWEP was able to apply for funding through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to help integrate telehealth technology into the academic curriculum, among other priorities. Because telehealth is a Health and Human Services priority in the ANE-NPR grant, the GWEP has requested funds to enhance the nurse practitioner residents' knowledge of telehealth.

Telehealth is a Health and Human Services priority in the ANE-NPR program. Pending budget approval, the CARES Supplemental Funding will provide a telehealth module and two types of telehealth kits: one for on-demand medical visits and the other for remote patient monitoring. The kits will allow for a more hands-on opportunity for the nurse practitioner residents to use this technology, which is now a very critical component of healthcare delivery in the age of COVID-19.
