The University of Southern Indiana (USI) was awarded a four-year \$1.7 million-dollar federal HRSA grant: "Advanced Nursing Education Nurse Practitioner Residency Program (ANE-NPR)." As we come to a close on our second year, we want to congratulate our 2021 cohort, which completes the program June 30. As we enter into our third year, the 2022 Psych Mental Health Nurse Practitioner resident begins July 1, 2021 and the Family Nurse Practitioner residents begin October 1, 2021.

The 2022 residents will begin developing their patient panels after an intensive six-week orientation. In preparation for providing care, the residents will participate in enhanced didactic sessions, mentoring and specialty rotations in southwest Indiana, plus much more.




