Remarkable Wanda Hibbitts Much has changed in the past 100 years; the accounting field has changed from pencils and paper ledgers to adding machines, to calculators, to computers and Excel sheets and from simple to complex taxation and compliance regulations. And as accounting education changed, Wanda Hibbitts evolved, too.



With a BS, she first taught bookkeeping in high school and then for 27 years taught accounting in business colleges. With a desire to teach at a college, Wanda applied to Indiana State University's new MBA program and became the first woman admitted to and graduate from that program. Thus, in 1970, she applied to ISUE and began teaching several business courses, including accounting. Quickly, Wanda became known as a caring and no-nonsense professor, advisor, and mentor. Many former students report they would not have attempted, let alone passed, the CPA exam without

Wanda's instruction, advice, and belief in them. Wanda set high expectations for her students and for herself. At age 60 she earned a PhD from Southern Illinois University, all the while teaching full time and commuting back and forth 100 miles

Wanda received the Distinguished Professor Award in 1986, the highest faculty award at USI, in recognition of her excellence in teaching, scholarship, and service. In 1987, Wanda retired as Professor Emerita of Business. Although much has changed in 100 years, Wanda's fierce interest in USI and in her former students has not. Indeed, more than 100 of them sent her birthday cards and letters to celebrate her 100th birthday in April. -- Nancy Bizal

Jerry Bulger's Flag After 30 years of service to USI in Facilities and Operations, Jerry Bulger retired in 2016. Earlier, he had served four years in the U.S. Navy and 25 years on Perry Township Volunteer Fire Department, many of those years as chief. In 2019, Jerry was recognized for 50 years of dedicated volunteer service by the Indiana Volunteer Firefighters Association.

Like most of us, Jerry remembers precisely where he was when he heard about the attack on New York City's Twin Towers: he was on University Boulevard and heard the news from USI Public Safety officer Larry Rogers, stationed in the booth then in front of the Administration Building. Along with others, Jerry went to the Physical Plant control room to watch developments on TV and try to understand these events.

After learning what some other organizations chose to do, Jerry decided we should fly a flag from the USI overpass. The original flag, smaller than the one used today, was purchased by Vanderburgh County Chiefs Association specifically for this purpose. The first year the flag flew with one Perry Township Fire Department truck present; over the years, the number of trucks and size of flag have grown. Jerry says people honk, wave, and stop to talk and thank them for flying the flag: "It's great to see there is still some pride in the country."

Every September 11, volunteers raise the flag by 7:00 a.m. and bring it down between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. On this year's 20th anniversary of the attack, Jerry hopes for help from other fire departments so they can fly the flag for 24 hours, from midnight to midnight.

When asked how long he plans to continue this tradition, Bulger said, "As long as this old man is able to do it!" --Phyllis Oeth '81
