REPORTING OF THE INCIDENT

Formal Resolution Process

Investigation

- Notice of allegation sent to the parties
- Parties are allowed to present evidence and witnesses
- Parties are sent a preliminary report and allowed 10 days to submit a written response

On-and-off-campus resources

• Supportive measures

Responsible Employee

• Invitation to meet with TIXC to discuss rights, resources, and options

Report to the Title IX Coordinator or

Outreach from Title IX Coordinator includes:

• Information about TIX office and the process

Initial Meeting

- Grievance procedures including the formal and informal process
- University's Resolution process including how to file a formal complaint
- Right to an advisor of choice

YES FORMAL COMPLAINT FILED by the Complainant or Title IX Coordinator(TIXC), if deemed appropriate

- TIXC will proceed with Formal Resolution process or Informal Resolution process
- Support Measures available



NO FORMAL COMPLAINT FILED

- Case Closed
- Support Measures offered

Investigation Report

- The investigator(s) will prepare a written report summarizing the information provided during the investigation
- The parties have 10 days to provide a written response

Hearing

- This is an opportunity for both parties to present their side of the situation in front of a decision maker in a recorded meeting
- In Title IX hearings, the parties' advisor of choice may cross-examine the other party and witnesses
- In Non-Title IX hearings, the decision-maker is responsible for all questioning of parties and witnesses

Notice of Outcome

- The parties will receive written notification regarding the hearing decision
- If there is a finding of responsibility, sanctions may be assigned for the respondent and remedies may be provided for the complainant
- Both parties have the opportunity to appeal the outcome
- If no appeal is filed, the case is closed
