The purpose of this newsletter is to keep stakeholders updated on progress and accomplishments of the Advanced Nurse Education – Nurse Practitioner Residency (ANE-NPR) Program.

In 2019, the University of Southern Indiana (USI) was awarded a four-year \$1.7 million federal HRSA grant to develop this 12-month residency program for nurse practitioner (NP) graduates in primary care settings serving rural and underserved populations in southwestern Indiana.

The program will support a total of 11 graduate NPs with a family nurse practitioner (FNP) or psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner (PMHNP) specialty over a three-year period of time.

USI is collaborating with community-based health clinics to provide these unique experiences:

- ECHO Community Healthcare
- Southwestern Behavioral Healthcare
- Southern Indiana Community Health Center

The residents focus will be both clinical and academic enhancements that will prepare them as primary care providers. The residency program includes precepted clinical practice, specialty rotations, mentoring sessions and enhanced didactic education.


