Students must complete all four (4) courses for PAC concentration: Interdisciplinary Perspectives on Aging; Health Policy & Aging; Regulatory Standards in Post-Acute Care; and Finance and Post-Acute Care. The program is a twelve (12) credit hour, post-baccalaureate certification.
