A Positive Approach to Dementia Care: Time to Reflect and Recover

What has changed for ourselves and others over the past two and a half years? How can we most effectively recover and move forward? We have all learned many lessons over the course of the pandemic, and it is now time for an honest assessment the current status of dementia care.
