



Fall Student Headcount Enrollment and FTE Enrollment 1992-2012






Educational Impact

- 2004 Fall Headcount Enrollment Reached an All-time High of 10,050 Students
- In Past Decade
 - Headcount Enrollment Increased by 35%
 - Full-time Student Enrollment Increased by 75%
- Over 3,000 Students or 28% Live in Student Housing

75% Live and Work in Indiana



Tuition and Fees

- Did Not Impose a \$1,000 Charge on New Students
- History of Maintaining Affordable Fee Structure
- Shared Responsibility to Maintain Affordability

State Appropriations

- Growing Disparity in State Funding
- ◆ Funding Received is 42% or \$3,240 Less than the Statewide Average Per Hoosier FTE Student
- Full Funding of Enrollment Formula Imperative to a Growing Campus
- Serious Concern for the University

 - Center to Address Applied Research and Economic Development Needs
 - Increased Demand to Provide Services to Business and Industry

- Bachelor of Science in Manufacturing Technology
 - Consolidation of Engineering Technology Programs
 - Demand for Technically-Trained Personnel
 - Prepare Students for Employment in Advanced Manufacturing



Quality Improvement Initiatives

- <u>Accelerated Baccalaureate</u>
 <u>Professional Nursing Education</u>
 <u>Program</u>
 - Shortage of Nurses
 - Completion of Second Non-Nursing Degree within 16 Months of Enrollment
